

Doral Central Park: Fishing Rules & License Information

The City of Doral follows Florida State Statute 379.354 and all other regulations. Fishing License information and pricing is from the Florida Fish & Wildlife Conservation Commission Regulations

Florida Statute 379.354

A license is required to attempt to take a fish. If you cast a line or catch and release, you need a fishing license. (Summarized from the Florida Statute 379.354)

Fishing Area Rules & Regulations

- Fishing only permitted in designated fishing areas.
- Persons fishing <u>must</u> have a valid fishing license unless covered by an exemption.
- Minors under 18 years old must be accompanied by an adult.
- Fishing poles and equipment must be attended at all times.
- No cutting of fish or bait on park premises.
- Railings must remain clear of all materials and shall not be used to prepare bait.
- Persons fishing must leave area clean after use.
- No Littering
- No fishing permitted after-sunset

Do I need a Fishing License?

License Exemptions:

- Youth under 16 years of age
- Resident seniors age 65 or older with proof of age or residency (such as a valid Florida Driver's License or ID Card) or possessing an optional Resident 65+ Hunt/Fish Certificate
- Florida residents certified as totally and permanently disabled who possess a <u>Florida Resident Disabled Person's</u> Hunting and Fishing License.
- Florida residents who are members of the Armed Forces of the United States, who are not stationed in this state and home on leave for 30 days or less, upon submission of orders.
- Individuals who are observing or filming someone else who is fishing or hunting and who are not assisting (baiting hooks, reeling, setting decoys, calling birds, etc.) in the take in any way.
- Disabled veterans or active or reserve duty military service members and their immediate family members and assistants, who are participating in a permitted outdoor recreational event, for which the Commission has issued a *Military/Disabled Veteran Event License Exemption Permit* to the event organizer.
- Those freshwater fishing during <u>free freshwater fishing days</u>.

License-Free Fishing Days

- First consecutive Saturday and Sunday in April
- Second consecutive Saturday and Sunday in June
