FLOODPLAIN MANAGEMENT

5 Quick *Tips*

1. **Clean up debris from your yard.** Debris, such as leaves and branches, can clog storm drains and contribute to flooding. Be sure to clean up debris from your yard regularly and do not throw grass clippings in the storm drain.
2. **Inspect your gutters and downspouts.** Make sure that your gutters and downspouts are clean and free of debris. Also, make sure that your downspouts are properly directed away from your foundation.
3. **Test your sump pump.** If you have a sump pump, be sure to test it regularly to make sure that it is working properly.
4. **Trim your trees and shrubs.** Overgrown trees and shrubs can fall on power lines and block roads during a storm. Be sure to trim your trees and shrubs regularly.
5. **Have a flood plan.** In the event of a flood, it is important to have a plan in place. This includes knowing where to go, what to take with you, and who to contact.

According to FEMA, flooding is the most common natural disaster in the United States, and it can cause billions of dollars in damage each year.

Q: What should I do if I live in a high flood risk area?

A: If you live in a special flood hazard area, it is important to take steps to protect your property from flooding. This includes installing a sump pump, purchasing flood insurance, or using low impact development (LID) such as rain barrels to collect water.

Q: What are the benefits of flood insurance (home and content)?

A: Flood insurance can help to protect you from the financial devastation that flooding can cause. Flood insurance can pay for repairs to your home and belongings, as well as additional living expenses if you are displaced from your home due to flooding.

Common Myths

Myth: I don't need flood insurance because I don't live in a high risk flood zone.**

Fact: Floods do not know the lines on a map. Even if you live in a low-risk flood zone, you are still at risk of flooding.

Myth: Flood insurance is too expensive.**

Fact: Flood insurance is more affordable than you might think and can save you thousands of dollars in repairs if your home is flooded.

FALL HOLIDAY SAFETY TIPS

As the fall season brings cooler weather and festive celebrations, we want to ensure that all residents enjoy a safe and happy time with their loved ones. Here are some essential safety tips to keep in mind during this vibrant season:



HOME SAFETY

- 1. Secure Your Home:** If you're traveling for the holidays, make sure all doors and windows are locked. Use timers for lights to give the appearance that someone is home, especially as the days get shorter.

TRAVEL SAFETY

General Election Referendum Questions

On May 8, 2024, the City of Doral Council passed on second reading Ordinance #2024-14 proposing amendments to the City Charter. Doral residents will vote on the following ballot measures during the **November 5, 2024** General Election.

Doral Referendum 1. Clarify Form of Government

The Charter currently provides that the City shall have a "Mayor-Council-Manager" form of government. It is proposed that the Charter be amended to clarify that the City shall have a "Council-Manager" form of government. The proposed amendment does not eliminate the position of the Mayor.

Shall the above-described amendment be adopted?

Doral Referendum 2. Revised Process for Creating Standing, Special, and Ad Hoc Committees, and Appointment of Members

The Charter currently provides that the Mayor creates and appoints, subject to Council approval, committees of the Council. It is proposed that the Charter be amended to change the manner in which said committees are created so that the Council may create and organize itself into standing committees, special committees, and ad hoc committees, and upon formation of any such committees, the Council may appoint its members.

Shall the above-described amendment be adopted?

Doral Referendum 3. Council Authorization Required When Mayor Dealing with Other Governmental Entities

The Charter currently provides that the Mayor is the official designated to represent the City in all dealings with other governmental entities. It is proposed that the Charter be amended to provide that no official action or position may be taken by the Mayor on behalf of the City in his/her dealings with other governmental entities except as authorized by the Council.

Shall the above-described amendment be adopted?

Doral Referendum 4. Requirement for Break in Service for Mayor Seeking Position of Councilmember

The Charter currently provides for a limitation on the consecutive length of service as Mayor, but allows individuals who served two consecutive terms as Mayor to seek the position of Councilmember without a break in service. It is proposed the Charter be amended to provide that individuals who serve two consecutive terms as Mayor must be out of office for four years before seeking a Councilmember position.

Doral Referendum 5. Mayor and Councilmember Compensation

The Charter currently provides that Mayor and Councilmembers' annual compensation is \$50,000 and \$12,000, respectively, which is adjusted annually using Urban CPI, and are currently \$77,587 and \$18,611. It is proposed the Charter be amended to cap the Mayor's compensation at the current salary of \$77,587; Councilmember compensation be adjusted and capped at 30% less than the Mayor's salary, which is \$54,310.90; and eliminate future increases, including CPI.

Doral Referendum 6. Revised Process for Appointment of City Manager

The Charter currently provides that the City Manager is selected differently than the other two Charter Officers, the City Attorney and City Clerk. It is proposed that the Charter be amended so that the appointment of the City Manager follows the same procedure as the City Attorney and the City Clerk, by providing that the Council selects the City Manager subsequent to the recommendation of a search committee.

Doral Referendum 9. Time Frame for Appointment of Charter Revision Commission; Revised Requirements for Members

The Charter currently provides for an Office of Charter Enforcement. It is proposed that the Charter be amended to eliminate said office, and to replace it with an Office of Inspector General, which is an independent body to perform investigations, audits, and oversight of municipal matters including City contracts, programs, and expenditures, in order to identify, investigate, and prevent inefficiencies, fraud, waste, mismanagement, misconduct, and abuse of power.
